

#### SUMMER BOOK REVIEW

Normal People By Sally Rooney Hogarth Trade Paperback 273 pages

<u>Normal People</u> is a novel set in Ireland about the onand-off relationship of two young adults: Marianne and Connell. They are exceptional students and attend Trinity College in Dublin. However, Marianne is an eccentric loner from an affluent family, while Connell is popular and athletic and from a working-class family. Both experience emotional turmoil.

During high school, they have a hidden love affair. "Her father died when she was thirteen and Connell has heard she has a mental illness now or something." He wants to stay popular and worries about how it might look, and she obliges. Their relationship began when Connell picks up his mother from Marianne's home, where she is a housekeeper. Before the Debs dance, he breaks up with her. Marianne feels broken, and then only goes to school for exams.

They get back together at Trinity, where Marianne is more stylish, social and popular and Connell is awkward from being working-class. They see each other, but also have other affairs. Social class and acceptability give them issues, but they are drawn to each other.

Toward the end of the novel, Connell is depressed from the suicide of his high school friend and soccer teammate, Rob, who was found dead in a river. He completes an intake questionnaire at the College Counseling Center and is given medication. He confides to his counselor Gillian that he hates it at Trinity and now feels he can never go back home. Gillian responds: "What we can do here is try to work on your feelings, and your thoughts, and your behaviors. We can't change your circumstances, but we can change how you respond to your circumstances."

At the funeral, Connell and Marianne get back together. At home, Connell is more confident about his relationship with Marianne and they attend parties together unashamed. Upon his return to Trinity, he becomes the editor of the college's literary journal. Furthermore, he is accepted into an MFA program in New York.

"You should go," Marianne says. "I will always be here. You know that."
